### <u>Urban Plan after the 3<sup>rd</sup> public consultation</u>

First, some news about the third public consultation held in Duhamel, on September 17, at 9:00 a.m. The purpose of the meeting was to make the plan, zoning bylaws and minor exceptions consistent with the MRC development plan.

The requests tabled were not a problem for those in attendance. For people representing the Lac Gagnon area, the main concern was zoning and five-bedroom B&Bs.

At Lac Gagnon, there are two zone classifications. **Zone 2R** includes land on the shores of Lac Gagnon and the Petite Nation river between the lake and Duhamel and **Zone 3R**, which is commercial, is located towards the south of the lake, and includes Poliquin camp ground and Domaine Aubry. This zone was extended by one lot with a width of 190 feet on the lake and 210 feet on the North-West road. This zone

allows construction of one inn with a maximum of 20 rooms. Motels are not permitted, and the rental of motorized craft and personal water craft is strictly prohibited.

In zones 2R and 3R the following are permitted: stand-alone single family dwellings with an apartment in the basement or a room for rent. In Duhamel, five-bedroom B&Bs are now permitted (formerly three bedrooms). We were successful in having one restriction adopted: on the waterfront, B&Bs must be at least one kilometre apart.

We were successful on a number of fronts when you consider the first plan tabled last December which expanded the commercial zone and allowed B&Bs without restrictions. Nevertheless, the new plan is not totally satisfactory. It was adopted on September 17 at a special meeting of the Municipal council.

If you wish to dispute the plan, you can sign a special register on October 15 between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. at the Duhamel town hall. In order for the plan to be subject to a referendum, 169 signatures are needed, failing which it will be adopted.

The new plan will be posted by the municipality until October 15 and explanatory documentation is available as well.

The new development plan proved to be an arduous task and monopolized the time and effort of several associations and taxpayers.

Thank you for your support, the final decision is up to you.

#### **Elections**

Several of the associations in the region worked together to bring new blood to the Municipal council. A small committee looked for potential candidates on the basis of criteria such as: sense of community, availability, listening, ability to promote projects and appropriate resources to ensure efficient municipal management.

The committee approached all of the associations in the area, i.e. property owners' associations of Lac Gagnon, Lac Simon, Petit Lac Preston, Lac Doré, Lac Chevreuil, Lac Iroquois, etc. as well as residents of the village to find candidates from all parts of the municipality. Their efforts to ensure a representative council resulted in a slate of candidates that includes five candidates from Lac Gagnon, one from Lac Simon and one from the village.

The team members share common priorities and values. They intend to serve the entire community and meet the needs of both villagers and cottage owners.

The team registered with the elections chairperson, Claire Dinel, during the week of September 5.


If you are not already registered to vote, you should send an SMR 9.2 registration form or, if you are a property owner, form SMR 9.1. The forms are available from the Municipality. The election chairperson should be mailing the electoral list shortly so you can confirm if you are on the list for the next elections.

The electoral list review is from October 15 to October 25. It comes into effect on October 28, after which time, no changes may be made.

Advance polling is on October 30, from noon to 8:00 p.m. Elections are on November 6 from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Cottage owners are only entitled to one vote per cottage, so it is very important that you make the effort to vote! Every vote counts if we want to bring about change! You should remember that municipal elections throughout the province of Québec are on the same day.
