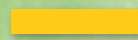

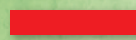
Lake activity zones



No wake zone
Maximum speed: 10k/h

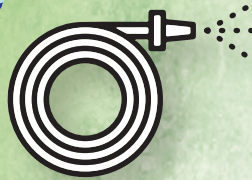


At least 100 metres from the shoreline
Activities that cause moderate waves (touring, water skiing, etc.)



300 metres from the shoreline
Activities that cause large waves (wake boarding, tubing, etc.). **You are responsible for the waves you make.**

Guidelines to prevent the introduction of invasive species



Wash any boat coming from another lake or river.

Boats must be inspected, washed and have a sticker or pass. Canoes, kayaks, paddleboards must also be washed.

Safety, respect, courtesy

Be responsible and courteous on the water. Think about the environment. Be aware of spawning grounds and other wildlife habitats near the shoreline. Lower

the volume of your sound system.

Keep a safe distance from swimmers, non-powered craft, swimming birds, buoys, etc.

When riding a jet ski, avoid races, stunts, tight turns and capsizing.

Avoid spills when filling up with gas.

Do not throw any waste in the water.

Use biodegradable products to clean your boat.

Do not pump oily or dirty water overboard.
